TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plaistow in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Plaistow on Tuesday, the 8th of March, next, at eight of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds now held by the Cemetery Trustees.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 5. Shall the provision of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property at public auction.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to repair sidewalks. (Recommended by the Budget Committee)
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to be set aside as a capital reserve fund and added to the present Fire Truck Reserve Fund, for the future purchase of a new fire truck.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Fire Engineers to contract for the purchase of a new fire truck and to expend all monies necessary and the interest accrued thereto, which has previously been appropriated in a Fire Truck Reserve Fund, including the appropriation voted in Article 8.

(Article 8 and 9 recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000, to expand the cemetery and improve said land.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$625.00 to install new front doors and lock for the Town Hall.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to install combination windows on the Plaistow Public Library.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for necessary brick pointing of the Town Hall building.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$325.00 to purchase a fireproof file to keep Town Clerk's records.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 to rebuild the cannons situated on the Town Hall park.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

15a. To see if the Town will vote to authorize setting up as a Capital Reserve Fund, the receipts from the sale of cemetery lots.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to repair the well house at Hale Spring.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as authorized by RSA 31:4, Par. XIX for the annual budget of the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

Article 18. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Seacoast Regional Development Association and the Seacoast Regional Plan.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

- 1. Every person or corporation doing business in this town under a name other than his or its own shall, on or before the first day of April in each year, file a certificate setting forth the name under which business is being done and the name or names and addresses of the person, persons or corporation owning or operating the same, and paying the Town Clerk a fee of one dollar for recording the same.
- 2. Penalty: Whoever fails to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than twenty-five dollars.
- 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately on its adoption by the Town Meeting.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to include in the Zoning Ordinances the following changes:

- 1. To protect the interests and property values of abutters, the establishment of any commercial or industrial enterprise shall not be allowed if 50% or more of the abutters object.
- 2. To protect the Town from having derelict and unused properties and further to protect existing businesses, gasoline service stations shall be restricted to one (1) for each 500 motor vehicles registered in Plaistow, New Hampshire.

(BY PETITION)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance as follows:

By transferring from commercial district to residential district, the westerly side of Route 125 beginning at the Boston and Maine Railroad tracks and running in a north-northwesterly direction to land commonly known as the Plaistow Drive-In Theatre.

(BY PETITION)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to increase the membership at large of the Municipal Budget Committee from nine to twelve members, and to authorize the Moderator to appoint the additional number to serve until the next regular Town Meeting in 1967. (In accordance with the Municipal Budget Act, the Committee shall consist of 3-6-9 or 12 members at large)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) for the purpose of constructing an overhead water storage tank together with the necessary pumps and piping for fire protection purposes, and to raise the said sum by the issuance of Town notes or bonds under the provision of the Municipal Finance Act, RSA ch. 33, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to negotiate and issue said bonds or notes, and to fix the rate of interest and all other terms thereof, and to take such other action as may be required to effectuate the purposes of this vote.

And further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply to the U. S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration for any benefits which may be available under the terms of Section 71C (a) of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 or any other pertinent statute, and to accept and apply any benefits obtained therefrom to a reduction in the amount to be raised by notes or bonds.

Article 24. To see whether the Town of Plaistow will adopt the following Ordinance:

SUNDAY SALES

- 1. Necessaries, etc. Retail businesses may be conducted on the Lord's Day for the sale of milk, bread and other necessaries of life, garden produce raised on the premises, drugs, medicines and medical supplies and equipment, newspapers and periodicals, and restaurants, motor fuel and lubricants, small automotive parts, without the necessity of any license or permit, or limitation on hours.
- 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately on its adoption.

Article 25. To see whether the Town of Plaistow will adopt the following ordinance:

- 1. Other Commodities: Other retail businesses may be conducted on the Lord's Day for the sale of motor fuel and lubricants, small automotive parts, groceries and provisions, clothing, footwear, toiletries, household supplies, sporting goods, hardware, novelties, notions, garden seeds, plants, supplies and equipment, nursery stock, furniture and antiques and second hand furniture. No person shall keep or maintain a place for the sale of such merchandise without first obtaining from the Board of Selectmen a license so to do, and paying the fee of five dollars (\$5.00) therefor. Each such license shall specify the hours which said shop or place of business shall be open. No such shop shall be open prior to one o'clock in the afternoon, and shall close not later than six o'clock in the afternoon.
- 2. No other person shall keep his place of business open for the conduct of trade on the Lord's Day.
- 3. Penalty: Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not more than ten dollars (10.00) or imprisioned not more than thirty (30) days or both, and he may be required to give sureties for good behavior for one year. (RSA 578-10)
- 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately on its adoption.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept as submitted the reports of Agents, Auditors and other officers and Committees heretofore appointed.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Your Town closed the year of 1965 with an unexpended balance of \$14,874.63 against the 1965 appropriations. The total surplus was \$43,129.36 an increase of \$8,344.87. In the year 1965, the Selectmen used \$10,000.00 of this surplus to keep the tax rate from increasing to a higher rate than the \$72.00 approved by the Tax Commission. There have been no changes in the valuation ratio.

The total valuation of Plaistow increased by \$614,212.00. The total valuation is \$6,895,956.00.

322 Veteran's exemptions amounted to \$333,950.00 a decrease over last year of \$5,100.00.

This year was marked with several problems; one of which was the establishment of a new disposal area brought about by the sale of the old dump site to the Timberlane Regional School District. The Selectmen had an extremely difficult task in finding what is now termed by State health and fire officials as "an almost perfect site." The Town acquired 20 plus acres and to consummate this business, an emergency appropriation of \$5,500 was requested and granted to develope the new disposal area, and a good site has been realized. Numerous other sites were investigated and the present site was deemed the best.

The Town acquired the Hale Spring and land and a road was built to the Spring which was used to good advantage this year due to the drought.

Negotiations and planning for the cemetery took considerable time and effort and at this time we would like to announce that we have entered into an agreement to acquire a sizeable piece of land from Mr. and Mrs. Paul D. Palmer for the sum of \$1.00. We have also acquired an additional piece from Mr. and Mrs. Nelson M. Schwaner. This land was also acquired in the same manner. We feel this amount of land will take care of some 1200 graves and meet the needs of the Town for many years to come.

Numerous roads were accepted by the Planning Board and as we look around the Town, we find the work well done. The roads in the new developments are wider than we have previously experienced.

The State Highway Department cooperated to take care of a drainage problem on the Kingston Road which will make for much safer passage for motorists.

The Town Road Aid money is being used to construct a new and wider bridge on the Crane Crossing Road. In connection with building this wider bridge, Mr. and Mrs. Claude Cox donated land to elimate a severe curve in the road for which we wish to express our sincere appreciation.

The Selectmen, working with the Industrial Commission, have been successful in assisting to attract two substantial businesses to this area. One is already established and one is in the process of constructing a building for future use. We are happy that we were instrumental in helping Mr. Keezer to make his decision to return to Plaistow. We feel that because our ratio of business to residental property is so low that a continued effort is extremely necessary to bring this ratio into better balance.

We must point out that your tax rate went up \$16.00 per thousand this year and this was brought about mostly by an increase in School costs and we would point out that 85.4% of your tax dollar is used for education.

The cannons on the Town Hall Park were removed due to their dangerous condition. This was done to prevent any possibility of injury to children. We hope that a program to refurbish and renew the cannons will be undertaken this year.

Your Selectmen have enjoyed the co-operation of all the people and departments in the Town. We have not solved all problems but with continued help from all, we will exert every effort to conduct our duties with efficiency and expedience.

We wish to take this opportunity to thank Mr. and Mrs. Paul D. Palmer, Mr. and Mrs. Nelson M. Schwaner and Mr. and Mrs. Claude Cox for their contributions to the Town.

We welcome all new residents to the Town and urge interest and participation in the affairs of the Town. We welcome constructive criticism and hope that you will make it a point to register and vote at the Town and School

District meetings. Our office is open every other Monday from 7:30 to usually mid-nite. Come in and Make Suggestions.

We feel that if Plaistow is to continue to progress, the cooperation of ALL its citizens and that of the various Town Committees elected and appointed will be necessary.

REPORT OF LIBRARIAN FOR 1965

Four neighborhood district meetings sponsored by the State Library at Concord, were held in Exeter and at libraries in the district. Your librarian and trustees attended these meeting, at which time new books were on display, book reviews were given, and various library topics were discussed.

At the first meeting, held at the District Office in Exeter, a film explaining Centralized Library Service was shown. Our trustees voted to join the Centralized State Library Program; thus enabling our library to order books through the State Library at a larger discount and with free postage.

One hundred and twenty-five dollars was allotted our library by the State Library for basic reference books. Twelve books were added to our reference shelf.

Mrs. Lucille Atwood, a trustee of this library, was elected Chairman of the Southeast District Advisory Council of the Statewide Library Development Program.

Two hundred and eighty-four Adult Non-Fiction books were borrowed from the State Library, and one thousand eight hundred and eighty Adult and Children's books were delivered by the Bookmobile on its four trips to the library.

Several activites were held by the Friends of the Library during the year. A Book and Food Sale was held on Memorial Day. Much appreciation is due the many people who donated books for the sale. In June a Hobby Show was held at the Pollard School. Two books on rocks were

awarded the winners. Some of the Friends Group have assisted me in carrying books to shut-ins, with the Bookmobile books, acting as Safety Patrol Leaders for school children coming to the library, and helping at the library. Several new books were donated to the library through the Birthday Club of the group. A major accomplishment of the "Friends" during the year was the incorporation of the Plaistow Library Building Association Incorporated. This matter was handled by a special committee from the "Friends", and it is now a fond hope that a new library building will be made available in the not too distant future.

The Second Grade Reading Club party was held in June at the Pollard School. A fine program, dealing with books, was furnished by the second grades. Ribbon awards for reading were given to the children by your librarians.

I have tried to provide books and material requested by the teachers of the Pollard School to meet the needs of the pupils. I certainly appreciate the cooperation of the teachers in submitting these assignments to me.

New window shades were bought, formica put on the receiving desk, and a telephone was installed. A set of Collier's Encyclopedias and two volumes of the Lincoln Libary were added to our reference collection.

I appreciate very much the gifts of books, magazines, and book marks donated to the library by interested friends and organizations.

I attended in July, for the second year, the Library Technique Course held at the University of New Hampshire. This course is sponsored by the State Library to educate librarians to better meet the needs of the public. This is my goal.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH 1965

I hereby submit the report of the Board of Health of Plaistow for the year 1965.

It had been an extremely busy year for this Board with the increase in building which has gone on in this town and the increase in its population.

There has been submitted to the State Department of Health the following cases of communicable diseases as required by the State Laws, and it is necessary that all such cases be reported either by the Doctor or the householder where ever such cases exists.

The District Health Nurse has been notified of 11 premature births as required by State Laws.

One certificate for the removal of a body from one of our cemeteries has been granted for interment elsewhere

Four, (4) permits have been granted for the home care of welfare children and two (2) have been denied for various reasons.

Seven (7) complaints were received and investigated and letters written and all were terminated with positive good health results.

The old dump was inspected and turned over to the Timberlane School Authority.

With the loss of the old dump a temporary dump was inspected and passed as usable for temporary purpose until a new one could be established.

This Board did request the State Sanitary Department to investigate a sewerage contamination of a drainage area by the usage of a dye test in the adjoining dwellings and such contamination was found to exist and suitable measures were taken to terminate such a condition.

As required by our Building ordinances all sewerage systems, whether replacements of old systems or construction of new ones, must be examined by this Board before completion and must conform to the requirements of the Board and must conform to the laws relative to existing or new water systems. Fourty (40) such examinations were made and all did conform to the law.

REPORT OF THE PLAISTOW FIRE DEPARTMENT

Following is the annual report of the Plaistow Fire Department for the year ending December 31, 1965.

The number of alarms answered was eighty-three. Seven of these were woods fires; four calls for assistance in searching for lost children; eleven automobile fires; three emergencies; three false alarms and sixteen were fires in buildings.

The total estimated fire damage, including insurance paid was thirty-two thousand dollars.

The department was called to assist at fires by the departments of Newton, N. H., Haverhill, and Merrimac, Mass. Plaistow called for assistance once from Haverhill and Atkinson and on two occasions from Newton.

The members of the department and association have constructed a two-truck addition and hose tower without any expense to the town except for material.

The Board of Fire Engineers asking at the Town Meeting of March 1966 the authority to purchase a new fire truck capable of carrying 1500 gallons of water. The cost of this truck to be made from the appropriations set aside by the voters at the town meetings of the past three years and the proposed appropriations of this year.

In closing I would like to thank the citizens for their cooperation during the dry season and in procuring permits for outside burning.

REPORT OF THE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION 1965

On April 26, 1965, a re-organizational meeting of the Plaistow Industrial Commission was called by the Board of Selectmen. Mr. Edward Bangs, Mr. William Morton, and Mr. Edward A. Ingalls, Jr. were appointed new members of the Commission.

Plans were undertaken immediately to determine the possibility of the relocation of the Keezer Manufacturing Company in Plaistow. After the completion of their new plant in October, this move was made by the Keezer Company. Keezer Manufacturing Company employs 180 people and is expanding.

In August, the resignation of Mr. Edward Bangs was accepted and Mr. Kenneth Bernard was appointed to fill the vacancy.

A meeting of all local realtors was held in September. This meeting was held jointly with the Planning Board, the Board of Selectmen and the Industrial Commission. As a result of this meeting, a sub-committee of the Industrial Commission was formed, comprised of all interested realtors and agents. This committee will up-date land for industrial use and review zoning needs.

In October, the Tamposi Realty Company of Nashua, N. H. purchased the former Court Products land and announced that Pennsylvania Box and Lumber Company of Warminster, Pennsylvania would lease part of this land. Further expansion of this property is imminent.

A State Industrial Conference, held in Dover, N. H. in October, was attended by several Commission members.

The Commission has held regular monthly meetings on the last Monday of each month with additional meetings as necessary. Maps of the area have been reviewed, additional industrial land areas are being sought, and contact has been made with State Officials to determine where financial aid is available to the town for industrial growth, either through State or Federal funds.

At the close of the year, we see many advantages that Plaistow has industrially. All of the following are assets:

- 1. Access to a major railroad line
- 2. Situated near by to Routes 495 and 125
- 3. Progressive school system, recognized nationally by acceptance for the Title III funds under the Johnson Education Act
- 4. Good residential areas
- 5. Available labor pool
- 6. Favorable industrial and commercial zoning
- 7. Available land

However, after study, the Industrial Commission recommends that the citizens of Plaistow take into consideration immediately the following needs:

- 1. A water tower for industrial use this creates a favorable insurance situation which industry demands and which we must have to compete in our geographic location.
- 2. A Master Plan Consideration is already being given by other groups within Plaistow to the development of a Master Plan. We believe this to be necessary for the best development of the town.

3. A printed brochure listing Plaistow's assets — This brochure should include, in addition to industrial advantages, a description of our local government and how it operates, a history of the town, maps, and pictures.

We feel that the outlook for Plaistow is exceedingly good. However, people make the progress — be a doer for the best interests of Plaistow.


