Agenda Item 4: Review/Approval of Minutes

ESTABLISH A POLICE AND FIRE DETAIL REVOLVING FUND Article P-23-10:

Ch. Knutsen said this article had been voted on before but the wording had changed recently and it needed to be voted on again. She read up to the in changes wording:

Shall the Town vote to establish a Police and Fire Detail Revolving Fund pursuant to RSA 31:95-h, for the purpose of purchasing, leasing, maintaining, and repairing all vehicles assigned for detail use including uniforms and other necessary expenses.

There was discussion of why the uniforms and expenses were added. J. DeRoche said the original revolving fund for the police detail included maintenance and replacement of the vehicles as well as uniforms for detail officers. He noted a detail officer may not work only in Plaistow and may not have a Plaistow uniform, and Plaistow and equipment are needed when working the Town details is paid from this fund. Full-time officers are part of the police department and uniformed from that budget. G. Colby noted that the current fund supports and pays for all outside detail expenses from outside detail income that is generated, and the article reestablishes what currently exists. J. Sherman noted he prefers to see the fire and police separated from the same warrant article.

R. Walling moved, second by D. Thompson to approve Article P-23-10

The motion was approved 7-0-0

Agenda Item 6: Public Hearing

Ch. Knutsen opened the Public Hearing at 6:45 PM. She said the Public Hearing is to consider the 2023 Proposed Budget and the Warrant Articles that go with it. She noted the budget increased by 6.43% and some of the driving factors for that were: utilities and fuel: end of life on server and significant pieces of IT equipment, also second year of PFOS/PFAS SSI study as requited y the Stat of NH; police fuel and equipment replacement, Fire fuel and increase in the number of calls for service, Highway significantly higher costs for paving, line striping and snow removal to maintain the current level of service; and debit service on the fire truck bond.

Ch. Knutsen invited comment on the budget. J. Sherman asked if anyone had done an analysis of the changes in operating budget to warrant articles, meaning if more is being put in the operating budget than warrant articles. Hs suggested the percentage change in the operating budget and the change in the total sum of warrant articles can be compared. He suggested that in one year the increase in the operating budget is more than the increase in the total warrant article, or the other way around. There were questions about the CIP. It was also suggested there could be a sizable increase from the school district.

It was noted that the BOS has finished the wording on the Voters' Guide and once it's cleaned up it will be emailed to the Budget Committee and posted. J. DeRoche noted that this year's warrant articles if approved will cost to the taxpayers \$137,000. He also said that the CIP Committee will present a final draft that will be presented to the Select Board.

(Majority vote required)

Article P-23-03 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate as an operating budget for the water department, not including appropriations by special warrant article and other

appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$494,090? Should this article be defeated, the operating budget shall be \$483,390 with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

This article shall be null and void if Article P-23-08 fails. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen (4-0-0)).

ESTABLISH A POLICE AND FIRE DETAIL REVOLVING FUND

Article P-23-10: Shall the Town vote to establish a Police and Fire Detail Revolving Fund pursuant to RSA 31:95-h, for the purpose of purchasing, leasing, maintaining, and repairing all vehicles assigned for detail use including uniforms and other necessary expenses. All revenues received for outside detail services will be deposited into the fund, and the money in the fund shall be allowed to accumulate from year to year and shall not be considered part of the town's general fund balance. The town treasurer shall have custody of all monies in the fund and shall

pay out the same upon order of the governing body and no further approval is required by the legislative body to expend. Such funds may be expended only for the purpose for which the fund was created. Shall the Town further vote to raise and appropriate \$100,000 to be deposited into the fund with the amount coming from the General Fund, Unassigned Fund Balance? This warrant article shall be null and void if Article P-23-09 does not pass.

Agenda Item 7. New Business/Old Business:

Ch. Knutsen noted the Deliberative Session will be held at 9:00 AM on February 4, 2023 in the second floor meeting room at Town Hall; snow date will be February 11th. She noted that the Budget Committee members should attend the session. J. DeRoche noted that there could be changes to the warrant articles that would require re-voting by the Budget Committee.

Voting will be held at the Fish and Game Club in March.

J. DeRoche corrected the amounts given earlier for the warrant articles. He said they are requesting about \$370,000 from the Unassigned Fund Balance to pay for six warrant articles, and

are asking the taxpayers to approve an additional \$237,000, totaling \$607,000. G. Colby said \$160,000 is really coming from the Police outside detail fund because it is being dissolved and refunded.

R. Anthony asked the amount taken from the Unassigned Fund to reduce the tax rate. J. DeRoche said it was around \$300,000. R. Anthony suggested this was the first time since 2017 that monies from the Unassigned Fund were used to reduce the tax rate that Plaistow residents pay and that as a resident he was appreciative that this was done.

Ch., Knutsen thanked Greg Colby and the Select Board for their hard work this year. She noted there will be no more meetings of the Committee until the Deliberative Session.

- G. Colby noted there will be five open positions on the Budget Committee and filing for the open positions will start on January 25 and run through February 3.
- J. DeRoche thanked Ch. Knutsen and the Committee for their time, effort and hard work.

There was no additional business presented. The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 pm.
