## COMMUNITY EVENT AND TRAINING

ADDICTION AND THE BRAIN & NALOXONE ADMINISTRATION



- The Danville Police Department will be hosting an ADDICTION AND THE BRAIN presentation followed by a NALOXONE ADMINISTRATION TRAINING. Residents from Danville and surrounding towns are invited to attend and learn about addiction and its effects on the brain as well as what to do in an overdose emergency including how to administer Naloxone, an emergency treatment used to reverse life-threatening effects associated with an opioid overdose.
- Chuck Hemeon, Director of Emergency Medical Services for the Town of Derry will be presenting and coordinating the training.
- The goal is to train the public about SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF OVERDOSE, stress the importance of calling 911 as well as the immediate actions they should take to ensure everyone's safety. The Naloxone training will provide hands on skill demonstration on rescue breathing, CPR and Naloxone administration. Local firefighters and EMTs will be assisting with the hands-on portion of the training. A Naloxone kit will be provided at no cost to those completing the training.
- This FREE TRAINING is open to the public and no personal information will be collected. Those attending will have the opportunity to meet the Staff from the South Central Public Health Network that has helped organize the event as well as learn more about what the Network does to support the 10 communities it serves.
